# TOWN OF MARCY SANITATION & RECYCLING SCHEDULE

All pickups coincide with your garbage collection.

All garbage, recyclables and large bulky items at roadside by 6:00 AM, but not sooner than the 24 hours before collection.

**NOTE: Ashes and sawdust MUST BE PUT IN PLASTIC BAGS. Flying ashes and sawdust can cause blindness! Please do not use bleach on garbage or recyclable bags or cans as it can cause blindness and it ruins clothes.**

**NOTE: All rubbish containers can be no larger than 45 gallons.**

When a Holiday falls on a Monday through Thursday, we will collect your garbage and recyclables on the day after. If the Holiday falls on a Friday, we will do our collection on Thursday.

If not collected please leave garbage and recyclables out the next day too, as sometimes we run out of time.

Holidays observed by the Sanitation Department: New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, President's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.

Garbage and recyclables must be on the side of the driveway opposite from the mailbox. (If mailbox is on the left, then the garbage and recyclables will be on the right side of the driveway.)

**All items listed below need to be placed loose, in Yellow Recycling bin or properly marked container no bigger than 45 gallons. Does not apply to Green Waste.**

<p><b>FOOD &amp; BEVERAGE GLASS METAL &amp; AEROSOL CANS MILK &amp; JUICE CARTONS JUICE BOXES</b></p> <p>Collected each week</p>	<p><b>Glass:</b> To be washed, (NO window panes, light bulbs, Corning glass or pottery.) <b>Metal Containers:</b> Tin &amp; aluminum cans, washed out, empty aerosol cans, (NO paint, pesticide or chemical aerosol cans.) (Empty paint cans: covers off, set along side of garbage.) <b>Milk &amp; Juice Cartons, Juice Boxes:</b> (Washed out) and placed loose in container</p>
<p><b>PLASTICS</b> Plastic Bottles, Cups &amp; Containers (With or Without Number Code) Collected each week</p>	<p><b>Plastics:</b> To be washed out, placed in Yellow Recycling bin or properly marked container. Soda bottles, milk, water, ketchup, mustard, baked goods containers, drink cups, soup cans, detergent bottles, etc.</p>
<p><b>NEWSPAPERS CORRUGATED CARDBOARD MAGAZINES FLAT CARDBOARD</b> (Cereal boxes, cake mix boxes, Gift boxes, Laundry detergent boxes, Paper towel cylinders, Pizza boxes, etc.) Collected each week</p>	<p><b>All Paper &amp; Cardboard Loose &amp; Placed in Recycle Container.</b> <b>Newspapers &amp; Ads:</b> Loose in container. <b>Corrugated Cardboard:</b> Boxes must be flattened (3'x3') not to exceed 40 lbs. (No waxed or plastic coated cardboard). <b>Magazines, Glossy Catalogs:</b> Loose in recycling container. <b>Flat Cardboard:</b> Remove paper, foil or plastic liner, plastic carrying handles. Flatten empty boxes, place loose in recycling container.</p>
<p><b>JUNK MAIL</b> (Envelopes, Ruled paper, Office paper, Colored paper) Collected each week</p>	<p><b>Junk Mail:</b> Put out with recyclables loose in recycling container. <b>Shredded Paper:</b> Place in a clear plastic bag</p>
<p><b>GREEN WASTE</b> (Lawn clippings, Leaves, Flowers, Shrubs) (Tree trimmings, Cut off Trees &amp; Shrubs) Collected weekly from April 1st to Dec 1st</p>	<p><b>Green Waste:</b> To be placed out in a container marked Green Waste or clear plastic bags only! <b>Not weighing more than 50 lbs.</b> If garbage is mixed with green waste or green waste is not in clear plastic bags or clearly marked container will not be picked up. <b>Tree Trimmings:</b> Cut 8 to 10 foot lengths, no larger than 10" diameter. Limit 1 Pile 4 foot high by 8 foot long, butt or cut end facing the road. Brush and limbs 4 foot and shorter tied in 40 lb. bundles. No brush or trees from land clearing projects will be collected.</p>

**No Contractor's Debris**  
**If a contractor cuts it, mows it or rakes it: they must remove.**  
**No stumps or rootballs will be picked up.**

<p><b>1st FULL WEEK OF EACH MONTH</b></p> <p>Tires, Batteries, Appliances</p> <p>All Light &amp; Heavy Metals (Must be separated from Garbage.)</p> <p>Electronics</p>	<p><b>Batteries:</b> Automotive acid type – NO LIMIT.</p> <p><b>Tires:</b> Not mounted on rims or wheels – <b>Limit 2 per household.</b></p> <p><b>Appliances:</b> Stoves, refrigerators, freezers, washers, dryers. Doors removed from all appliances. (Must be garbage-free and empty). Hot water tanks, air conditioners &amp; dehumidifiers.</p> <p><b>Light Metal:</b> Pots and pans, metal lawn chairs, metal storm windows, doors, tables, chairs, metal cabinets, bicycles, lawn mowers, swing sets and all light metals cut into 6 foot lengths.</p> <p><b>Heavy Metals:</b> Cast iron, Cast iron tubs, sinks, pumps, engine blocks and all heavy steel.</p> <p>All fuel tanks cut in half. Drum or pails larger than five (5) gallons must be cut in half.</p> <p><b>Electronics:</b> TV's, Computers, Microwaves, Fax Machines, GPS, SEE LIST ON LAST PAGE</p>
<p><b>2nd FULL WEEK OF EACH MONTH</b></p> <p>Large Household Furnishings</p>	<p><b>Household Items:</b> Stuffed furniture, box springs, mattresses, tables, chairs, rugs (in 4 foot lengths), pads, artificial xmas trees.</p>
<p><b>3rd FULL WEEK OF EACH MONTH</b></p> <p>Construction &amp; Demolition Debris</p>	<p><b>Construction &amp; Demolition Debris:</b> Small projects will be picked up if properly bundled or containerized – 6 foot lengths, limit four (4) containers or bundles per household, NOT to exceed 40 lbs. each. Also ceramic and fiberglass sinks, toilets and bathtubs. Fiberglass tub enclosures and hot tubs.</p> <p><b>NO CONTRACTORS DEBRIS:</b> Large projects must hire Dumpster Service. It will not get collected!</p>

## HERE'S HOW IT WORKS

★ All Recyclable Items Mix Together In One Bin For Collection ★

1. All recyclable items—paper, plastic, metal, and glass—need to be mixed together loosely in one container.
2. Recyclables must be placed in your designated recycling bin or a durable or plastic metal lidded container of your choice, under 35 gallons and not more than 50 pounds.
3. Lids and labels should be left on recyclable containers. Containers should be empty and rinsed before recycling.
4. Do not place recyclables in plastic bags for collection. No string, no trash or green waste allowed.

**DO NOT INCLUDE:**  
Hard Cover Books, Napkins, Paper Plates, Tissue Paper, Soda & Beer Cartons, or Construction Paper



### PLASTIC

Plastic Bottles & Containers (With and Without Recycling Number Codes)  
Milk & Water Jugs  
Cottage Cheese, Yogurt & Pudding Cup Containers  
Soap & Detergent Containers

**DO NOT INCLUDE:**  
Plastic Bags, Styrofoam Containers, Toys, Motor Oil Bottles, Prescription Bottles or Clothes Hangers



### METAL

Food & Beverage Cans  
Deposit Cans  
Aluminum Foil  
Aluminum Plates & Trays  
Aerosol Cans  
Metal Lids

**DO NOT INCLUDE:**  
Propane Tanks, Metal-Cardboard Containers (Cocoa & Motor Oil), Clothes Hangers, Silverware or Small Appliances



### GLASS

Green, Amber & Clear Containers  
Canning Jars  
Deposit Bottles  
Liquor & Wine Bottles  
Food & Beverage Containers

**DO NOT INCLUDE:**  
Broken Glass, Drinking Glasses, Ovenware or Ceramics, Dishes, Mirrors, Window Glass or Light Bulbs

★ ONLY ONE EXCEPTION TO THE RULE: SHREDDED PAPER – Place in a clear plastic bag with your recyclables ★

#### Items That SHOULD NOT Be Placed In Your Recycling Bin
